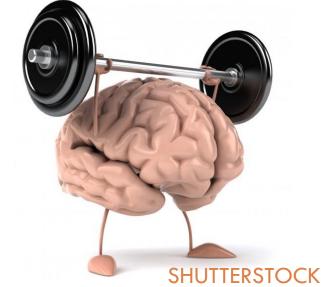

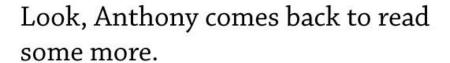

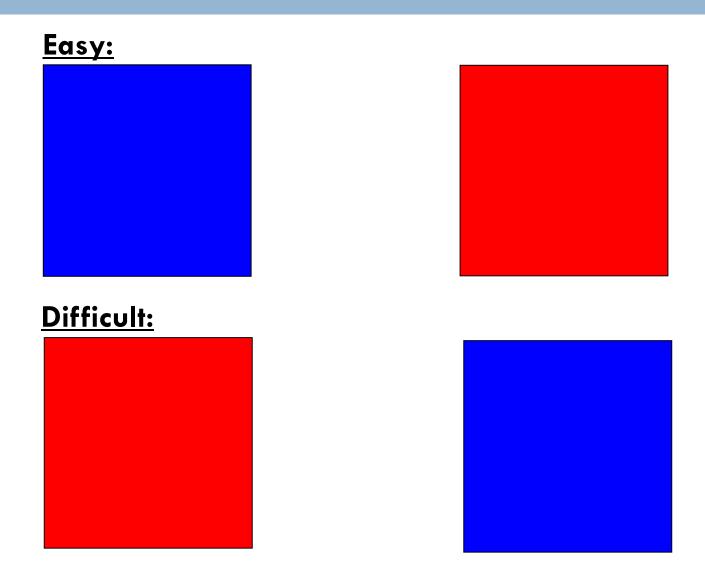






Where did Anthony put the book? Where is the book now? Where will Anthony look for the book first?

Use and/or exposure to various languages at the same time eventually seems to become effortless

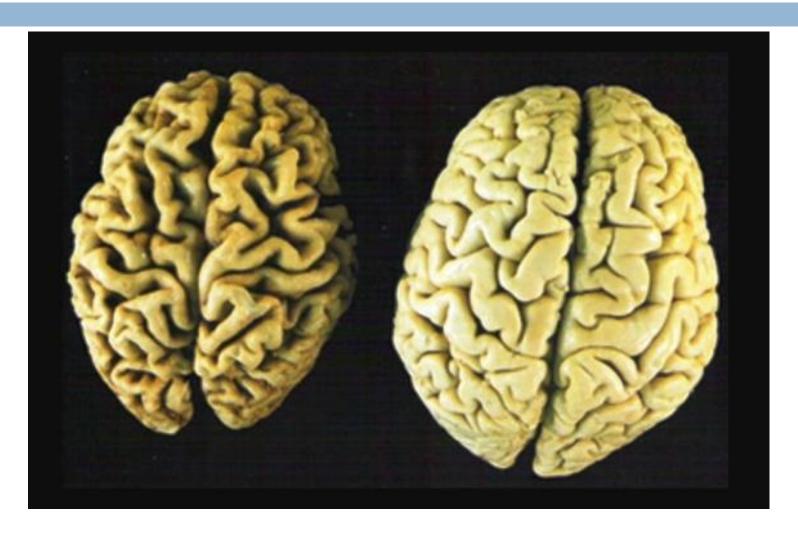
